

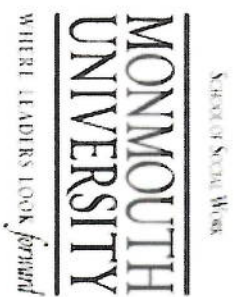
Presenters:

Jenna Quinn is a child sexual abuse survivor, author, TED speaker, and the namesake of Jenna's Law. In 2009 Jenna's Law was the first comprehensive child sexual abuse prevention education law in the US named after a survivor. It requires that each school district adopt and implement a prevention policy that educates students, teachers, and parents on how to prevent, recognize and report child sexual abuse. Jenna travels educating and sharing her story and the importance of CACs.

Kellie Quinn is the mother, and strong supporter of Jenna Quinn through her disclosure, survivorship, and advocacy. Kellie Quinn not only brings the perspective of being a mom, but also of being an educator into the advocacy work in the realm of child sexual abuse.

Amelia Wachter-Smith is the Family Practice Chief with the Administrative Office of the Courts. She has a long history with the New Jersey court system and has great knowledge of the Sexual Assault Survivor's Act. Amelia Wachter-Smith is a strong supporter of family justice and positive interactions with the New Jersey Family Court system.

Amelia Hamarman is the Manager of STD Education and Special Projects with the New Jersey Department of Health and Adjunct Associate Professor at Widener University in Pennsylvania. She was a NJ Department of Health STD Research Scientist and Education Network Coordinator for 12 years and continues to provide education and awareness in her current role. She works to ensure best practices through delivery of services and educational initiatives.
